For a one-time only fee of \$250, your 2011 foals (sired by an ASRGN Nominated Sire) will have lifetime eligibility to win Grand National prize money in any division, at any age, wherever ASRGN classes are held. ASRGN recording is transferable to subsequent owners without payment of additional fees.

The only other requirement for participation in American Saddlebred Registry Grand National is membership in the American Saddlebred Horse Association. All owners, original recorders, and stallion nominators must be current members of ASHA at the time of the competition to receive prize money.

Mares and geldings only. Entries must be shown with a full mane and tail. Tails must not be gingered or put in any device which alters their carriage while on the grounds, before and during the show, as well as in preparation for the show entered. Shown at a flat walk, trot and canter. Horses must stand quietly and back readily in the line-up. Judged 75% on manners, performance, presence and quality; 25% on total conformation. **Subchapter SB-12**

Entries in all classes must be shown with a full mane and tail. Note: Horses shown in any class in the Saddlebred Division other than In Hand classes are ineligible to show in a Saddlebred Pleasure Horse class at the same show. Saddlebred Pleasure Horses may, however, enter any class in other sections for which they are qualified. Cross-entering at the same competition is prohibited between Show Pleasure and Country Pleasure, Three-Gaited Pleasure and Five-Gaited Pleasure. **Subchapter SB-7**

In order to compete, all Hackney ponies must be registered with the American Hackney Horse Society and/or the Canadian Hackney Horse Society. They must be entered in their full registered names, with registration numbers and under the name(s) of the owner of record with the AHHS or CHHS. Exception: Ponies shown in the harness division of an USEF Regular Member Show prior to December 31, 1989. For competition purposes, the maximum height of Hackney ponies is 14.2 hands. Appropriate attire requested for headers. **Subchapter HK-4**

Conditions and Specifications

GENERAL

In order to compete, all horses must be registered with the American Saddlebred Registry or the Canadian Livestock Records Corporation. They must be entered in their full registered names with registration numbers and under the names of the owner(s) of record with the A.S.R. or the C.L.R.C. A copy of the registration papers showing proof of ownership, or a copy of the registration papers with a Certificate of Eligibility to Show issued by the American Saddlebred Registry must be submitted with entry form at the time of making entry or presented to competition office before competition number will be released; competition management is responsible for notifying exhibitors of this requirement. See GR1309.2a(5). Exception: Horses shown in any USEF Regular Competition prior to December 31, 1979, and Saddlebred-type ponies.

Stake or Championship Classes:

To be eligible, horses must have been entered, shown and judged in one other class in their respective division.

UPHA Classics require nomination fee to UPHA. May be paid at show.

ACADEMY CLASSES

The Lesson Horse:

1. Open only to horses or ponies used in a Lesson Program.
2. Horses may cross enter in performance classes at the same show.
3. Academy Performance classes shall be judged on the rider's horsemanship and the overall picture of the rider and horse.
4. Academy Equitation classes shall be judged on Basic Equitation skills.
5. English tack is to be used, unless otherwise specified. Full, snaffle or Pelham bridles may be used.

The Academy Rider:

1. Open to students enrolled in a lesson program.
2. An Academy Rider may cross enter in another division, but not at the same show, with the exception of driving classes.
3. Headers are allowed in all Academy classes if needed for safety.
4. Once a rider has shown in a canter class – of any breed – they may not return to the Walk/Trot Division.
5. Age of entries is determined by the age as of Dec. 1 of the previous year – USEF rules.
6. Braiding and hoof blackening is optional.
7. Acceptable Attire – dark slacks or jods, boots or footwear with heels, collared shirt with vest or sweater, mans tie, derbies or other traditional headgear is optional. No riding suits or day coats are allowed.
8. Neatness of attire and cleanliness of tack will be judged.

The Academy Maiden Division:

1. For riders who have never won a blue ribbon in a walk/trot/canter class.

The Academy Limit Division: For riders who have won less than six blue ribbons in walk/ trot/ canter classes. Maiden riders qualify for this division.

The Advanced Academy Division:

1. For riders who have won six or more blue ribbons AND have competed in the Academy Walk/Trot/Canter division for at least 2 years.
2. All blue ribbons won in the last two years (Dec. 1, 2009 – Dec. 1, 2011) in the W/T/C division – in any division – count toward which division you will show in.
3. Blue ribbons won in a one horse class do not count.
4. Any rider wishing to move up to the Advanced division may do so, but may not return to the Limit division.

MEDAL CLASSES

USEF SADDLE SEAT MEDAL:

Open to all breeds. Open to Junior Active Members of USEF who have not yet reached their 18th birthday. A rider must place first or second to qualify for the final ride-off. Two or more individual tests of the top four competitors are required. Tests 1-16. To fill a class two competitors must show with proper appointments. Qualifies for the 2012 Finals.

UPHA CHALLENGE CUP, 10 & UNDER – WALK/TROT:

Open to riders who have not been judged in a class that required a canter. To be judged on the rail at the walk and trot only. All ribbon winners will be eligible for the UPHA Ten & Under Walk-Trot Championship Class at the end of the show season. Riders in this class are also eligible to compete in Class 116 Saddle Seat Equitation 10 & Under, W/T.

UPHA CHALLENGE CUP – 17 & UNDER:

Open to all saddle seat equitation riders, 17 years of age and under, riding a mare or gelding of any type horse. Mandatory workout as follows: "Trot a serpentine to the opposite end of the ring. Return down the rail at a show trot." To be shown at a walk, show trot and canter. The winner is eligible for the Chapter, National Junior UPHA Challenge Cup Championships and will be eliminated from further competition in qualifying classes this season. Challenge Cup and 8 ribbons. Winner will qualify for 2012 Finals.

SADDLE & BRIDLE SADDLEBRED PLEASURE MEDALLION :

Open to all saddle seat pleasure equitation riders, 17 years of age & under, who have ridden only an American Saddlebred Pleasure or Country Pleasure horse in equitation during the show season. Top four riders are required to do a workout. The winner is eligible to compete in the 2012 Finals.
